
Falsettos

Judith will escort you around her 2.5 hectare garden of 100 per scent beauty established in 1878 - a canopy of mature trees, massed rhododendrons, secret paths surrounding the lily covered pond towered over by wisteria in bloom and more.

Next stop is Pam Hailstone's 12 year old garden. Pam, an award winning garden designer, writer and painter has created an optical illusion of a rambling country garden on an average size suburban block at Crafers - an intimate garden of surprises.

After a delicious lunch at the village of Aldgate we visit the spectacular Wittunga Botanic Gardens, devoted to Australian and South African trees and shrubs. The gardens include 175 eucalyptus and plants native to the Mt Lofty Ranges through to Cape Jervis, a lake and billabong, ideal habitats for honey eaters, lorikeets, Rosellas, wood and black ducks.

Our final garden is actually a series of gardens on a 20 acre property – Windborne Park, Forest

Range. Dean Butcher and Kim Williams have created a herb garden, terraced vegetable garden, a rose walk with Greek columns in an apple orchard, a secluded "bottom" garden with contemplation areas by a flowing creek and more. Stroll at your own pace, afternoon tea or wine and cheese is served on the terrace overlooking rolling hills and Mt Torrens. Then back to Adelaide after a day of horticultural bliss.


Team Adelaide Ten Pin Bowling Tournament



Spend a few lazy hours checking out the cultural centre of Adelaide situated on the plaza behind Parliament House, overlooking Elder Park and the Torrens Lake. (Guided tours of the Festival Centre are held several times daily. Enquire at the Box Office in the foyer or phone 8216 8600).

During Feast: the Opening Night Party will be held on the Terrace, Cabaret season in the Piano Bar, performances by the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and State Opera in the Festival Theatre, and theatre in The Space.

Buy a sandwich from the kiosk and feed the ducks on Torrens Lake in Elder Park, the site of Picnic in the Park, the very popular final event of the Feast calendar. Walk west along the river to the Weir, or east to the Zoo on Frome Road (where guided tours will be held during Feast). Enjoy the scenery, including the lunchtime and early evening joggers.

North Terrace; Adelaide's Cultural Boulevard:

You can get all the culture you need in one hit on North Terrace - history, architecture, art, education, gardens and more! Walking east from the corner of King William Street there's Government House, The State Library, Museum (fabulous new Aboriginal Cultures Gallery), Art Gallery, Elder Hall (Feast rush-hour concert), and Adelaide University. Over Frome Road, past the Hospital are the Botanic Gardens with award-winning tropical conservatory, and newly restored Victorian palm-house.

A few minutes from the Botanic Gardens at 253 Grenfell Street is Tandanya, the National Aboriginal Cultural Institute. It's also a Feast venue and exhibition space. Excellent cafe and arts and crafts shop too.



Shopping, Strolling, Eating

Rundle Mall is the main shopping drag in the city, with many diversionary arcades (check out the restored Victorian era Adelaide and Gays Arcades). Adelaide institutions on this strip include Haighs Chocolates (on the Beehive Corner at King William St), Balfours Tearooms (treat yourself to a green frog cake) and just around the corner at 27 Gawler Place - Ditters Fruit and Nuts.

Over Pulteney Street is Rundle Street East, with boutique shops, art film houses, bookshops, and an endless variety of trendy sidewalk cafes and restaurants lining the street all the way to East Terrace (Alfrescos has the best coffee and home-made gelati).

Back the other way, across King William Street is Hindley Street and the West End, where you'll find strip joints, tattoo parlours, and pubs cheek by jowl with art and craft galleries, bookshops, cafes and restaurants, and the offices of the Feast Festival, Adelaide Festival and ArtsSA in the fabulously ornate Wests Coffee Palace building. Lots of Feast visual arts exhibitions in Hindley Street, including Shop@rt. The Pleasure Shop at 116 Hindley if you need head cleaner. Over Morphett Street, the Mercury Cinema (Feast Film Festival), Jam Factory Contemporary Arts and Crafts Gallery, and the Lion Theatre and Bar (Feast theatre/music venue). At 188 Hindley St is Caos Cafe, home to Feast's Forums and other events and a great place to eat.

Further south in the city, running west off Victoria Square are Grote and Gouger Streets. At 14 Grote Street is the Flinders Art Museum (Feast exhibition venue), and across the street from Her Majesty's Theatre is the entrance to the famous 130 year old Adelaide Central Markets, with hundreds of stalls offering fresh produce and gourmet specialties. Try to get a seat at Lucia's Restaurant on the western side for the best pasta and coffee, or the Asian Gourmet nearby for laksa. Walk through to Gouger Street where you'll find Chinatown, and an amazing cultural mix of shops, restaurants and cafes. The best fish cafes in town are here. At 120 Gouger St is the Balcony Theatre (home of the Australian Dance Theatre, and a Feast venue). Downstairs is Adelaide's legendary gay nightclub, the Mars Bar.

Why not book to go on one of Feast's famed Adelaide Gay History Walks - this year focussing on gay history round Victoria Square?


There are shopping, browsing, and eating treats just outside the city centre too, in historical inner suburban locations popular with gays and lesbians. Just up King William Road is North Adelaide's old world charm and elegant modern style. In particular, O'Connell Street and Melbourne Street boutiques, cafes and pubs to try.

East of the city is The Parade at Norwood. Bluestone cottages, leafy streets, ethnic variety. The Norwood Concert Hall (Feast's Fantasy Ball venue), and just around the corner the Orange Lane Markets on the weekend (arts and crafts bargains). And at 240 The Parade, Murphy Sisters (gay & lesbian) Bookshop. Follow King William Road south to Hyde Park for antique shops, designer fashions, Victorian lace verandahs and vine-covered sidewalk cafes.

Then there's Semaphore and Port Adelaide (20 mins down the Port Road from the city) - home of Seaside Feast, a weekend of readings, performances and lunches for lesbians.

Semaphore Road has the faded charm of a Victorian seaside resort, (check out the Public Library in the ornate remains of the Ozone Theatre), and Port Adelaide is an historical harbour precinct, with a fascinating Maritime Museum, boutique pubs, arts and crafts colony and fresh fish market every Sunday. Home to Vitalstatistix Women's Theatre Company, in Nile Street (Feast theatre/forum venue).

while you're here



The Beaches and The Hills

Take your pick. You can be soaking up the sun or strolling through a rustic village street within half an hour of leaving the city. To the west lies St Vincent Gulf and miles of suburban beaches. (Worth a visit are Henley - seaside cafes around the Square; Glenelg - walk around the new Marina, and south along the Esplanade past the Grand Hotel to the Broadway Kiosk). To the east are the historic towns and wineries of the Adelaide Hills, Travel up the freeway to Hahndorf, stop for German coffee and cake, drive back through picturesque country lanes via Mylor, Aldgate and Stirling. The Hills are alive... with the sights, sounds and colours of Spring.

Further Afield

South Australia is world-famous for its wines. The wineries of the Barossa Valley and Clare Valley north of Adelaide, and the Southern Vales on Fleurieu Peninsula are just a day-trip away. Or stay overnight in a country cottage B&B.

On Fleurieu Peninsula the Hills meet the Sea. Visit McLaren Vale wineries, the seaside village of Port Willunga (especially the Star of Greece cafe), and stunningly beautiful Maslins Beach-Australia's first nude bathing beach, sheltered by spectacular sandstone cliffs.

Take the ferry to Kangaroo Island for a day trip, or stay overnight - visit historic towns, pirate coves, seal bay, limestone caves, remarkable rocks, and national parks. Phone Feast's travel agent Marylou Byrnes for tours, car hire and accommodation ideas (8231 3020).


Clubbing

Super-chic Syrup is held here on the last Saturday night of the month. Mainly grrrls, but also smartly turned out boyz. Syrup during Feast is on Sat Oct 28.

The Cougar Leather Club meets on the first and third Tuesday of the month at the Wheatsheaf Hotel, George Street, Thebarton, 9pm-midnight. Traditional Aussie pub atmosphere. Mostly men, women welcome. Cougar hosts the official Feast Dance Party -Deliverance 2.
