The Feast Hub, at the Lion Arts Centre, will be alive with music, cabaret, theatre, dance and happenings by performers under 30 for everyone to check out and enjoy. A highlight will be Overdrive – 8 hours of live music not to be missed.

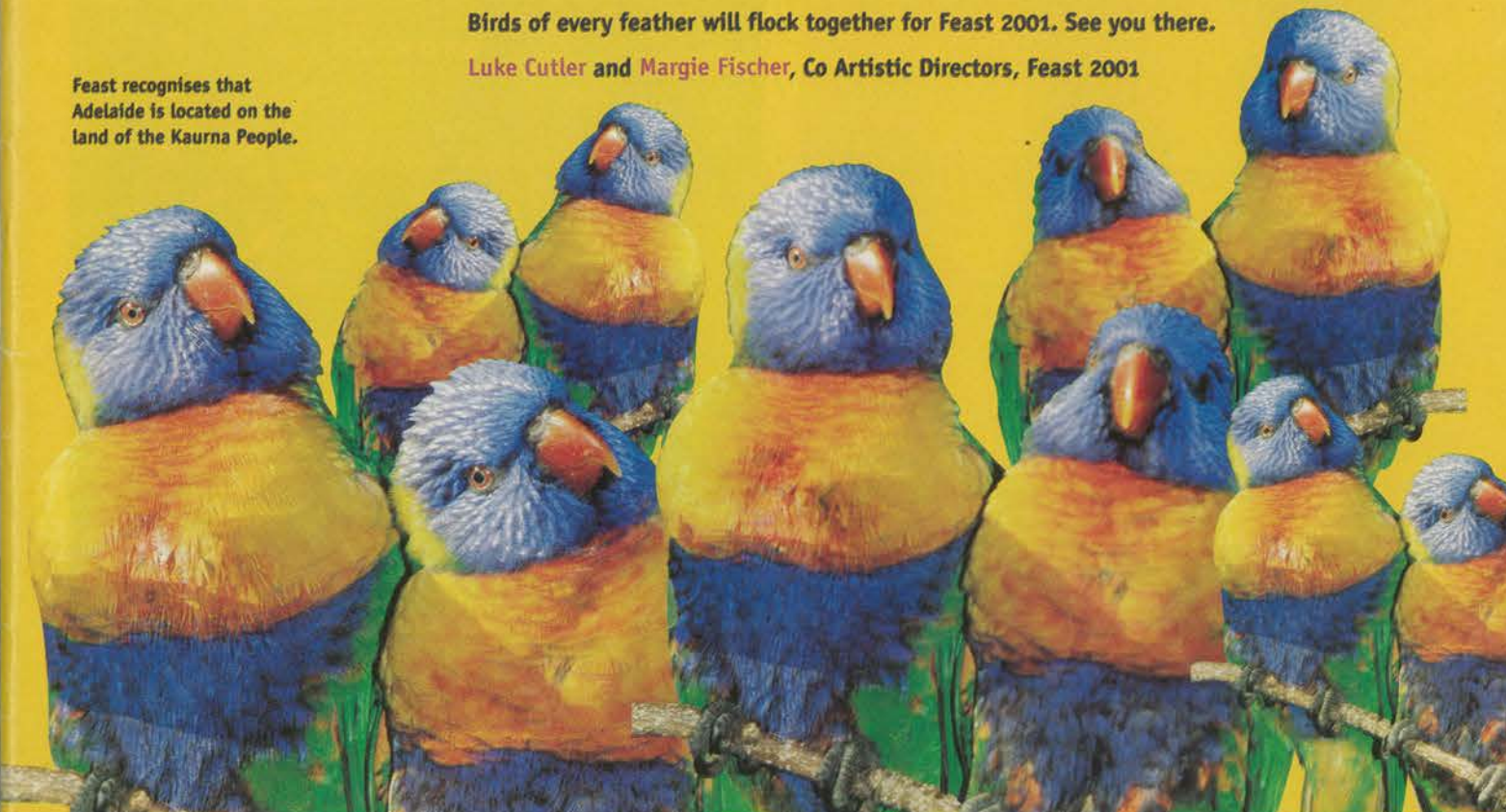

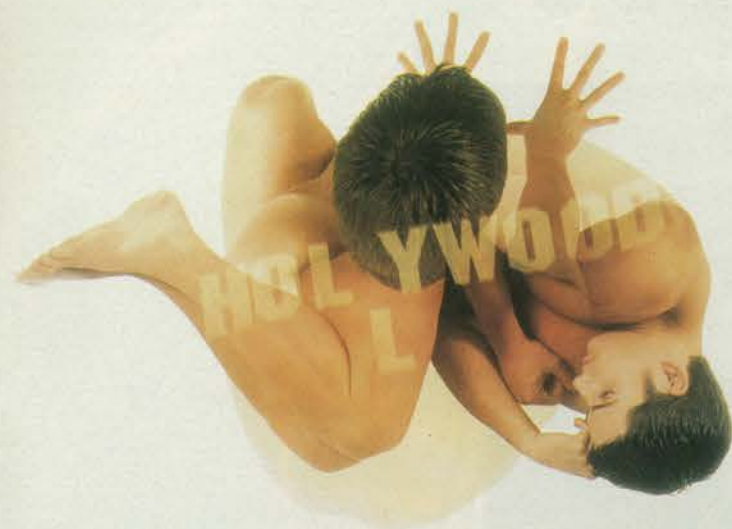
BENFX and Jamie Iversen (Redemption, Sydney Sleaze Ball and Mardi Gras) are set to amaze again with a fabulous light show.

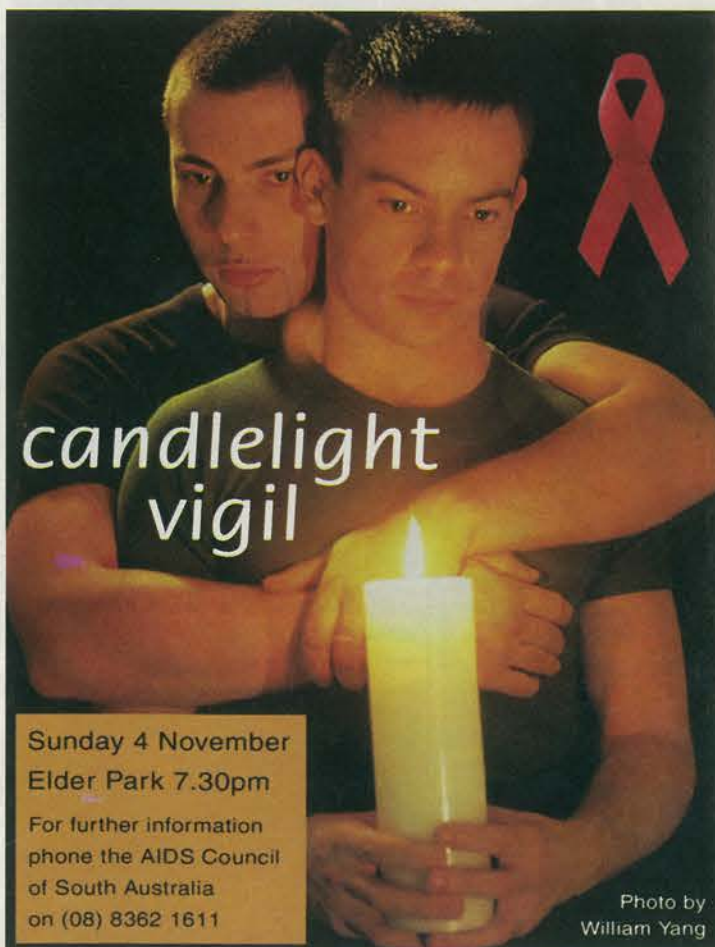

The Pink Files

It tells the amazing stories of Adelaide men and women who dared to live the gay life through decades of social, cultural and legal oppression. It is a heady mix of drama, comedy, love, sex, murder, politics, life in prison, revolution, war and teenage rebellion. Beginning with two young soldiers falling in love at the Palais Ballroom on New Year's Eve in 1942, culminating with the achievement of gay law reform in the 1970s. 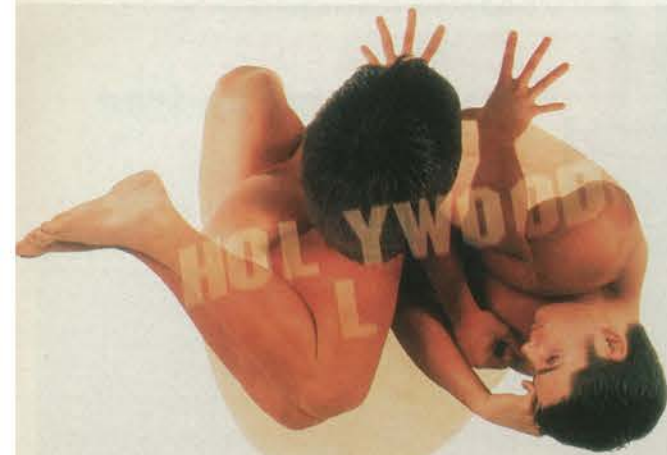

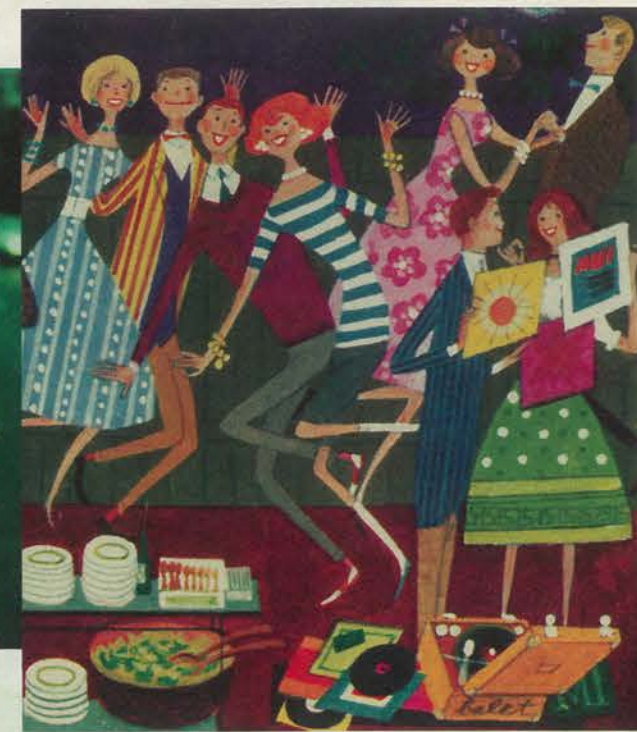

Our lunch stop is @22, a gay owned cafe in the heart of arty Bowden serving fresh food in a stylish welcoming atmosphere.

On to David Baptiste and Peter Fiege's own inner city garden – calm, green, perfumed, with different spaces to relax and unwind. Birds of paradise, gardenias, maiden hair fern, bromeliads, pink and white wisteria grow amidst ferns – a haven of peace.

Then to a little piece of Cairns in Cumberland Park. A blank canvas ten years ago, now a tropical oasis with many camp, eccentric touches. John Bywaters and Shane Dinnison invite you to meander by the pool and waterfall, tropical foliage and swaying palms, a patio with a mirror ball and chandelier, fountains, objet d'art and many unusual plants, while sipping champagne.

Cassandra Reilly (Judy Davis) is a globe-trotting
American living in Barcelona. She's translating a Latin
American novel into English, but needs to take other
work to pay the rent.

French with English subtitles

Carefree Felix is living with his boyfriend, Daniel, in the little town of Dieppe in Northern France. Aside from some pesky HIV, Felix has a pretty decent life. He's happily unemployed, leaving him time to watch soaps, and he's got a cute, employed boyfriend who wants to kiss him all the time.

Still, he thinks something is missing, so he decides to take a road trip to Marseilles to track down the father he's never met. Backpack in tow, Felix sets out walking, hitchhiking and borrowing cars to get to the South of France.

Springtime is budding, nature is at its best, and some unique characters await Felix along the dirt roads and byways of the French countryside. As Felix, Sami Bouajila gives a sweet, sexy performance that makes it easy to see why everyone who meets this happy-go-lucky wanderer wants to feed him, bed him, or drag him behind some bushes. Each of his fellow travellers needs something from Felix, each has something to give, and each has something to teach him.

Initially determined to find his real father, Felix begins to construct instead his own, elected ideal family. By the time Felix reaches Marseilles, his yearnings for family are already satisfied.

Chutney Popcorn

NISHA GANATRA, 1999, USA, 102 MINS

Reena (Nisha Ganatra) is an aspiring photographer, beautician and an Indian American lesbian. She is happy living with her girlfriend Lisa (Jill Hennessey from TV's Law and Order) but struggles to find acceptance from her traditional mother (Madhur Jaffrey) especially when she continually finds herself compared to her less radical sister Sarita (Sakina Jaffrey).

Things become much more complicated when Sarita finds that she can't have children and Reena volunteers to be artificially inseminated by Sarita's husband Mitch. Mitch is all for the idea, but nothing goes according to plan. The story takes Reena, her girlfriend and their loved ones on a roller coaster ride through pregnancy, birth and everything in between.

Chutney Popcorn is the first feature-length film to represent the Indian American lesbian experience. It was co-written, scored, acted and directed by second generation Indian Americans, and utilizes a hard-hitting original fusion of alternative rock music and traditional Indian music sampled, performed and created to depict the intensity of two cultures joining together. Chutney is a timely comedy about the meaning of family, American queer lifestyles and Indian traditions.

A Boy Named Sue

JULIE WYMAN, 2000, USA, 56 MINS

A documentary filmed over 5 years that charts San Francisco butch dyke Sue's gender transformation into Theo - "a self confessed transman with pussy".

The film successfully captures Theo's physiological and psychological changes during the process, as well as their effects on his lesbian lover and community of close friends. Taking full advantage of the unlimited access she received into an extraordinarily personal process, Wyman carefully composes a moving story about gender identity, relationships, and how even things that seem permanent can change.

'The One of Your Dreams I'll Be' asks the simple question "Who Are You?" and traces its characters' inner mirrors, softly vanishing the line that differentiates being a man and being a woman.

Not Quite

LIZ RICHARDS, 2000, USA, 6 MINS

'Not Quite' is a poetic exploration of the difference between sex and gender, illustrating how the narrator is caught between perceptions of male and female.

XXXV

PORTER GALE, LALEH SOOMEKH, 2000, USA, 13 MINS

XXXV is the stirring portrait of two intersex individuals born with ambiguous genitalia and their struggle against the medical establishment and society's enforced bipolar gender system.

Phalloogy

JAY SENNET, 2001, USA, 3 MINS

An autobiographical film using spoken word, music and experimental techniques to explore experiences of a female-to-male transsexual.
