


Rock Bottom

THIS IMPORTANT, SEXY, EXPLICIT and shocking documentary follows the journeys of seven gay men struggling with crystal meth addiction and recovery against a backdrop of an emerging second wave of HIV infection. While not a huge phenomenon in Adelaide as yet, Meth is cutting swathes through the gay community in the USA, Europe and to some extent the eastern states of Australia. From the drug's effects sexual desire, health and wellbeing, Rock Bottom delivers a chilling portrait of a community in crisis. Cameras go from sex clubs to hospitals to family gatherings. Rock Bottom lifts the lid on the mystery of Meth - and shows if anyone thinks they can play and not get hooked, how wrong they might be.

GAY, LESBIAN AND TRANSGENDER filmmakers, actors and critics explore the history of queer cinema in this made-for-cable documentary. Eschewing any overarching narration, co-directors Lesli Klainberg and Lisa Ades illustrate archival footage and film clips with dozens of interviews. They also provide timelines and factoids to punctuate the discussion of specific eras. Although the background material and the interviewees allude to the subtext of Hollywood classics, the bounty of world cinema and the history of experimental film, the focus remains squarely on the American independent movement, from the 1960s underground through the New Queer Cinema of the early 1990s to the post-Brokeback Mountain landscape of 2006. Interview subjects range from cultural commentator Michael Musto and actors Allan Cumming and Jane Lynch to directors John Cameron Mitchell, Jennie Livingston and Randy Barbato.




