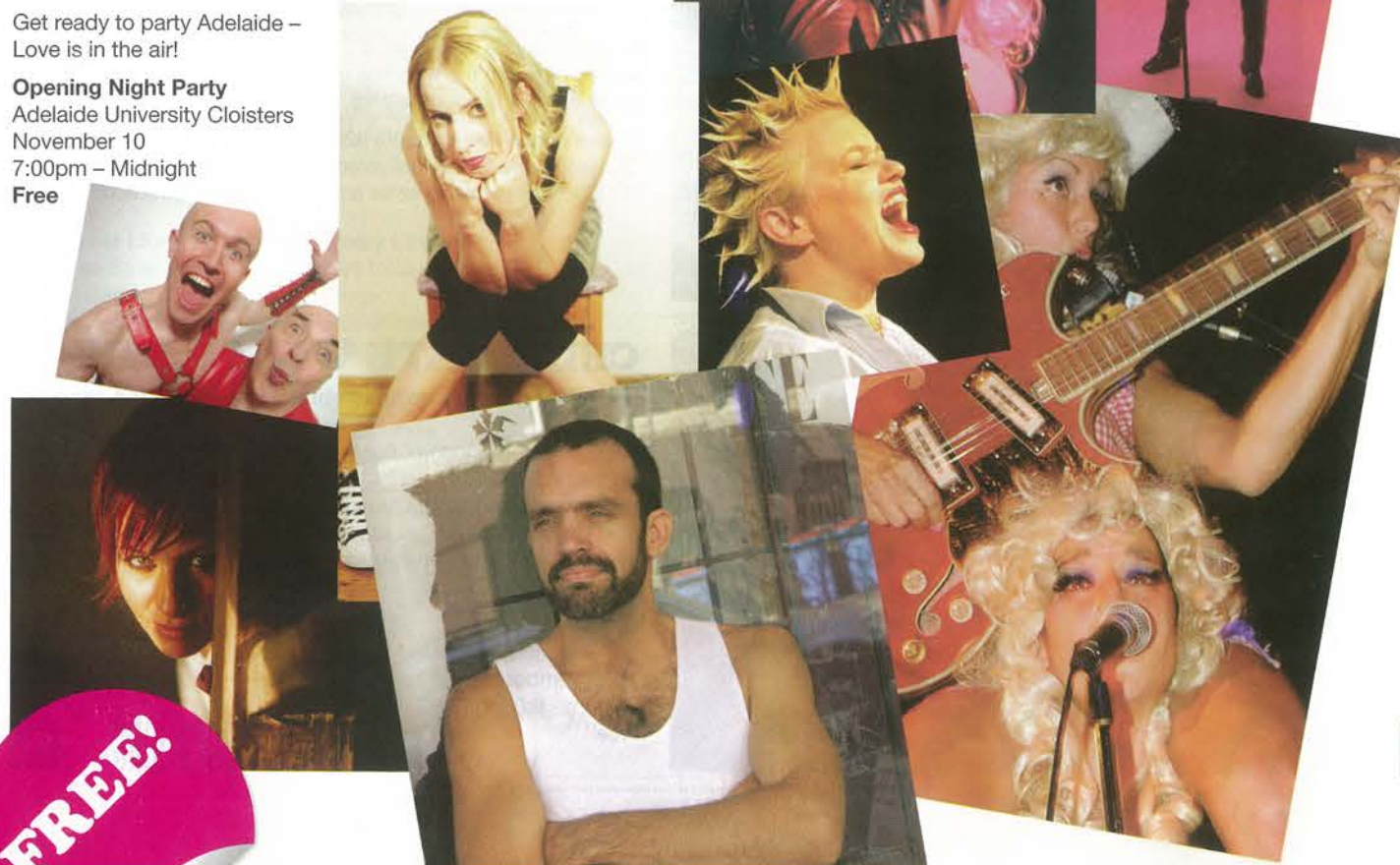
OPENING NIGHT PARTY
