In person:

BASS has a number of outlets throughout South Australia, in the Adelaide CBD and various suburban locations. Look under 'BASS' in the White Pages to locate your nearest outlet. All BASS agencies operate during normal retail hours.

At the door:

You can try your luck at the door of the venue but with such great shows we'd hate for you to be disappointed so we thoroughly recommend booking your tickets early!

Throughout this program you will see that many events have the clubFEAST, Fringe Benefits or GreenRoom logo.

Ticket prices in the Feast Program appear in the following order:

\$Full/\$Concession (student/pensioner/unemployed)/\$Discount (clubFEAST/Fringe Benefits/GreenRoom). Please note that not all events offer multiple prices. Proof of concession or eligibility for clubFEAST or other discounts will be required when you collect your tickets.

Access Information

Feast is committed to ensuring Feast produced events are as accessible as possible and we have encouraged registered event holders to do the same. The Feast office now has an Access Steward to provide detailed access information on Feast produced events.

When booking tickets to events inform the staff of any access requirements. An Access Steward will be at all Feast produced events to assist with access needs.

Feast's Hub, Higher Ground, is wheelchair accessible except for Art Base. The main entrance to Higher Ground has a drop off/ pick up zone, drive down Philip St to the venue. Limited disability car parking is available directly outside Higher Ground.

Public accessible parking is available off Hindley Street close to Higher Ground (an hourly rate is payable). The closest car park can be entered from either Philip Street or Hindley Street. There are other car parks nearby and street parking is possible.

Nexus, Tandanya and The Bakehouse are fully accessible.

Opening Night and Picnic in the Park have improved access.
