Feast dedicates Feast 2009 to Geoff Crowhurst 23/03/51 - 04/07/09

Geoff was a very special man. He was visionary, kind, patient, supportive, generous, brave, optimistic and wise. His contribution to Feast was huge. He worked as Feast's Finance Manager, Festival Coordinator and was a Feast Board member over a number of years.

Geoff was among South Australia's best-known independent theatre directors. We remember his brilliant work as Artistic Director of Mainstreet Theatre and Junction Theatre. He cofounded The Lampshade Shop and Not So Straight Theatre and freelanced with many SA theatre companies.

He took theatre into the community working with Indigenous people, migrant workers, the queer community, disabled people, the union movement and many more. He championed Australian writers for theatre, commissioning and directing countless new works. Geoff was a generous collaborator, inspiring all those he




bridgeland zwei is a bisexual-bilingual performance.
