## Ticket prices

With the introduction of FEASTiX comes more flexibility with ticket offers. In 2010 we want to encourage you to PRE PURCHASE tickets as opposed to waiting until the last minute and buying on the DOOR; some shows it will cost LESS to pre purchase tickets or might include something 'extra'.

### PRE PURCHASE: Do you want CHEAP

**Tickets??** Better PRE PURCHASED ticket prices may be available when buying tickets by any means prior to 4.30pm on the day of the event; with the exception of weekend matinees, which is prior to 11.30am on the day of the event.

**DOOR:** means buying tickets at the DOOR of the relevant venue after 4.30pm (or when relevant venue DOOR/Box Office opens) on the day of the event; with the exception of weekend matinees which is after 11.30am on the day of the event.

## Ticket collection

**Tickets will not be posted out**, they should be collected at the relevant venue's Box Office after 5pm daily (or when it opens), with the exception of weekend matinees when tickets should be collected after Midday (or when it opens) on the day of the event. *WordFeast* and *Quench* Day Passes can be collected and will be on sale from the The Window Box one hour prior to the event start time. When booking online, please print the booking receipt and retain for your reference.
