INTERNATIONAL SINGING SENSATION: HORSE

Award-winning trans porn star and LGBTI icon Buck Angel hits Feast for a week of inspiring, sexy and fun events.

Known as "the world's most famous transgender man", Buck Angel isn't just an icon of the LGBTI community, he's a worldwide pop culture

Born a girl in Los Angeles, California, Buck is internationally renowned for his pioneering role as the first transsexual man to enter the mainstream adult entertainment industry.

He single handedly redefined porn for a new generation, in 2007 becoming the first man to win the AVN Transsexual Performer of the Year award – the adult industry's equivalent of an Oscar.

But Buck is more than just a transman and pornographer. An inspirational speaker, sex educator, writer and advocate for LGBTI rights, his message of empowerment through self-acceptance and being sexually comfortable in one's own skin has struck a chord with people all over the world.

Buck not only inspires people to think outside the box, he redefines gender and shines a spotlight on the fluidity of sexuality and identity politics.
