ARIA-nominated string quartet, Acacia Quartet has earned consistent critical acclaim for their performances of this work.

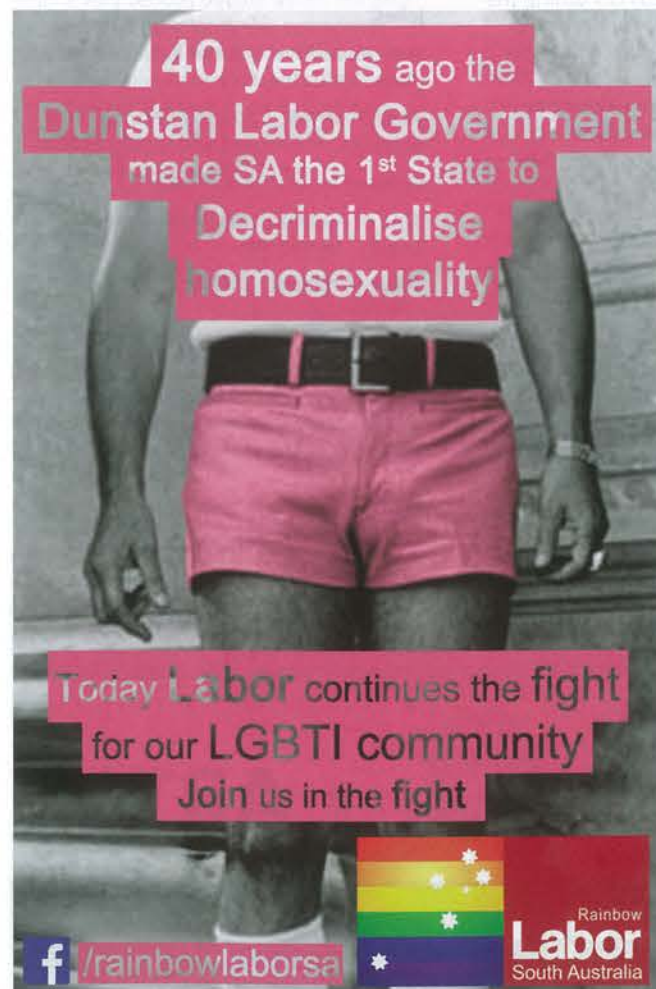

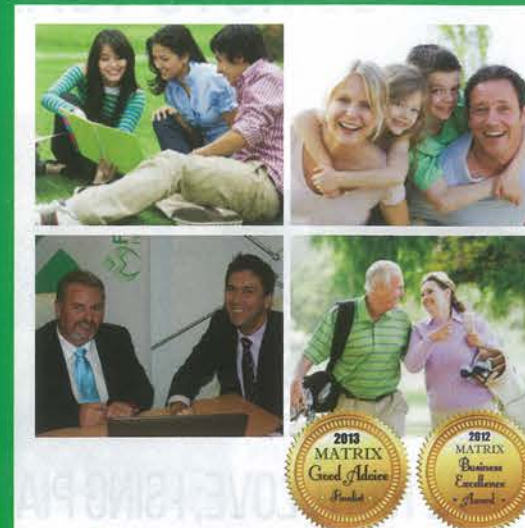

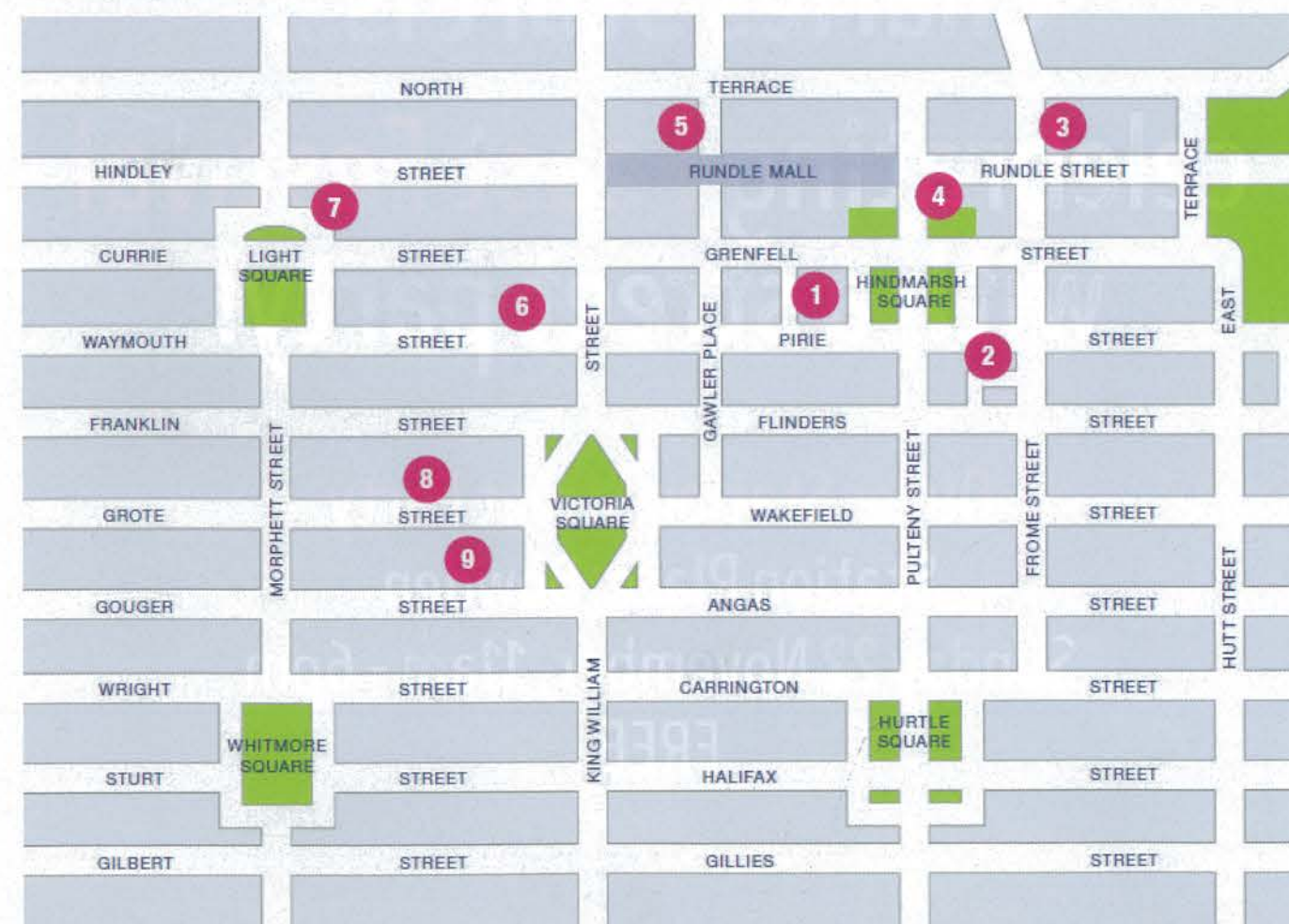
