
Lose yourself in Adelaide's network of laneways that wind their way from the busy eateries in Chinatown to the pubs and clubs of the West End. Down well-worn steps, and between old stone facades, the chatter of gin bars and cocktail lounges blends in with jazz bands and dub-step. With something new around every corner you never know what you'll trip over. And as the sun sets and your stomach rumbles you'll find the best food trucks parked next to fine dining while tapas is served nearly as late as the all night takeout joints.











WHAT started out as a blue sky opportunity for their parents in 1993 has become an unexpected calling for brothers Marty and Ben Tolstoshev. John and Helen Tolstoshev bought the property that has now become the Lane Vineyard over 20 years ago, positioned right in the heart of the Ad-

But in September last year, they retired and passed the baton to their sons. "The old man used to say to me 'we're an overnight success that actually took 20 years," Ben says, with a laugh.

"It has taken a long time - since we planted in 1993, we've outgrown its

"Mum and dad were the pioneers and they saw an opportunity to realize a dream."

While the parents were more 'blue sky entreprenuers', Ben and Marty see their job now as 'custodians of the land' - continuing and building on the prestige and lineage passed onto them.

"We really want to hand it onto the next generation," Ben says.

"I've got twin boys, they're hilarious and just into everything and my brother has a beautiful little daughter. But time will tell.

"It's an amazing opportunity for us to keep polishing."

Ben worked as a designer and art director for South Australian wineries, and Marty gave up his day job as an underwater clearance diver in the Navy to take on their new roles.

"He brings the military precision to it," Ben adds.

"It's a really good ying and yang relationship, we're good mates too. We're here for fun as well as business."

The Lane Vineyard is a winery, a vineyard, and it even has a tasting room. Not to mention its wines are seen in some of the hottest international restaurants, bistros and bars - and it is the top listed brand from the Adelaide you won't regret it.

"We've always seen the potential of the vineyards as they're quite special sights, its been a long held dream to carry on the evolution of the business," Ben says.

"I think there's a generosity spirit (here), and it's a very welcoming place. There's nothing presumptuous about it, its' a quintessential Aussie experience. Casual bliss you can really come and taste through the wines at your leisure, or sit down and have lunch, from a chef's tables. There's a vibrancy and an energy to our place, the view is just spectacular."

"Our wines really have elegancy, finesse and purity," he says.

"They have one foot in the old world and one foot in the new world." The vineyard is the perfect place for a visitor in the region for the Feast Festival. It offers great value that you can "cog up or down".

"It's all about relaxing and slowing down, it's really a beautiful place with

regional produce and lets you relax and soak it all up," Ben says.

"We're not a pretentious at all, that's what garners us to the LGBTI community. It's just a natural fit."
