




### A MESSAGE OF CHANGE FROM THE CHAIR OF FEAST FESTIVAL



As of the end of August those councils who will fly the rainbow flag are:




































# FRUIT LIVE AT THE CHURCH





# THE IAN PURCELI ORATION


lan Purcell was a prominent advocate for the LGBTIQ community in SA who was known as the "Godfather of the Gay Community". He dedicated his life to fight discrimination against the LGBTIQ community.
