FLYING THE RAINBOW FLAG

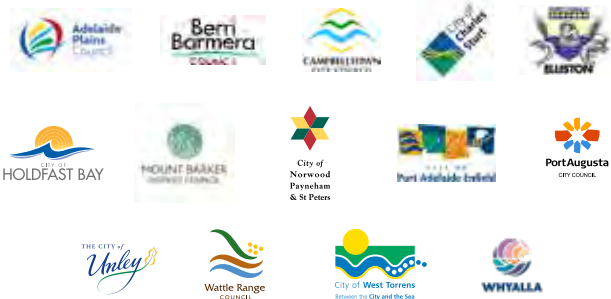
Every year Feast invites the Mayor and CEO of each municipal council in South Australia to show their support for LGBTIQ people and their families living in their community by flying the rainbow flag for the duration of the Feast Festival, 7 Nov – 29 Nov 2020. This year Feast also invited all municipal councils to fly the rainbow flag for an entire month to celebrate Feast's initiative, "Pridevember" – celebrating everything Queer here in South Australia for the entire month of November.

Flying the rainbow flag actively contributes to the health and well-being of the whole community and is a symbolic way in which councils can help celebrate the Festival state-wide, as well as publicly acknowledging their councils role in promoting and celebrating diversity.

This year we are pleased to announce that we have 27 municipal councils participating, some for various days during the Festival, some for the duration of Feast and some for the entire month of November. 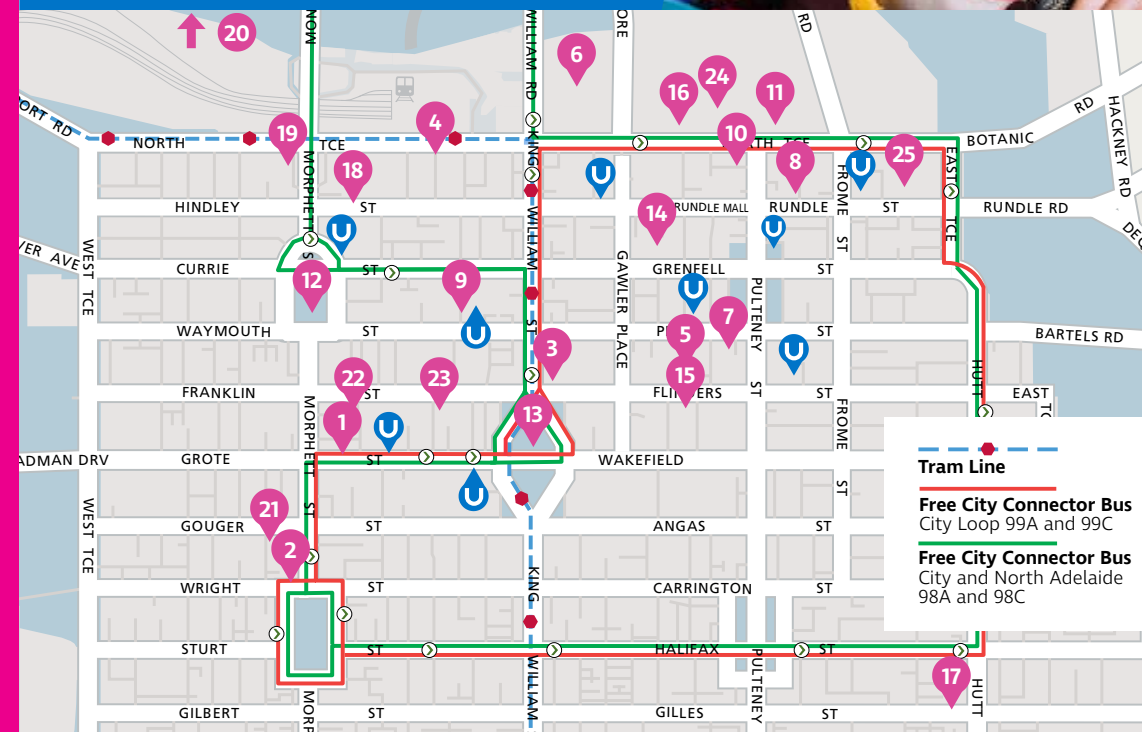
